- Visit traditional and modern business operations



Target 2.0

This annual economics competition, run by the Treasury, gets students to act as the Monetary Policy Committee and requires them to gather relevant and up to date data and apply their economics knowledge to set interest rates and the level quantitative easing (QE) to keep inflation at the government's target of 2.0%





CIPFA management competition

This competition, run by the leading public sector accounting profession, tests students' ability to deal with the real life problems faced by mangers in the public sector and the pressures of managing multi million pound budgets

IFS Investor Challenge

Run by the London Institute of Banking & Finance the aim of this competition is to introduce students to the theory an complexity of financial investment by giving them a "virtual" £100,000 which they then incest in stock and shares to see if they can grow their investment
