SCHOOL FUND

In common with many schools, we have a School Fund which is used to support a wide variety of extra-curricular activities ranging from occasions such as the inter-house cooking competition to sporting events. The number and variety of extra-curricular activities we offer are amongst the strengths of King Edward VI School, but they rely on funding, as well as on the enthusiasm of students and the good will of staff. Government funding allows us to facilitate our curriculum but does not leave much to fund these vital experiences for our pupils.

To assist us with funding we ask for an annual donation of £15 for each of the two youngest children in a family on the school roll. We do understand that in these testing times it may not be possible to make the full contribution but any contribution you can make towards the annual subscription will be greatly appreciated. You can pay this in one amount of £15 or £5 per term per child.

If you wish to make a further donation for other causes, we have a school Trust Fund which supports one-off larger projects, this is also set up on ParentPay and contributions can also be Gift Aided. The Trust Fund is committed to supporting projects that support students in taking pride in their school and their environment. Recent donations have supported our third food serving point (known as The Hatch) and the new trophy cabinet in the link corridor for our new building.
