Dear Parents and Carers,

Following the parent / carer session at the Year 7 induction meeting, this letter provides more information about GO 4 Schools, the system that we use for collecting and sharing information with you. It is important that all parents and carers have access to GO 4 Schools to see up to date information about attendance and behaviour events and to access the annual report, but ***please note that you will not be able to access the system until after your child has started with us in September.***

From September, what information will I be able to see?

- **Timetable** - a summary of the timetable for that day, plus a link to view the full timetable.
- **Attendance data** – shown from the start of the academic year up until the previous day and breaking down authorised and unauthorised absences as per the national attendance coding structure. Further information about the coding structure can be found in the Attendance Policy on the Policies and Documents page of the school website under the Information tab.
- **Behaviour** – a summary and further breakdown of all behaviour events, positive and negative since the start of the school year.
- **Reports** – students receive one written progress report during the academic year with an approach to learning rating, comment and a progress indicator for each subject.

NB. Real-time target and progress information is not made available on GO 4 Schools for students in Years 7 and 8 but information in exercise books or on test papers will indicate how they are performing, and feedback will be provided during parents' evenings and on reports.

The GO 4 Schools notification function is used to communicate with you about detentions and weekly behaviour updates.

You will only be able to see information about your own child.

How do I access GO 4 Schools?

GO 4 Schools can be accessed via a web browser (e.g., Microsoft Edge, Chrome, Safari etc.) or a free to access app.

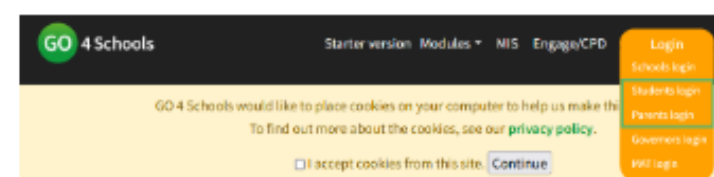

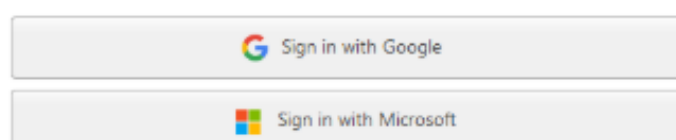

Logging into the GO 4 Schools Website



Access the GO 4 Schools website at **www.go4schools.com** and hover over the **Login menu** to see a list of Portals in GO.

- If you are a student, choose **Student**.
- If you are a parent, choose **Parent**.



Use either Google or Microsoft Sign-in methods to verify your identity and log into GO 4 Schools.

Please ask your school if these methods are not enabled for you.



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


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What the App can show you:

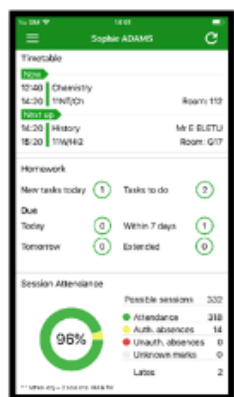
Currently you can view timetable, attendance, and behaviour information. For students in Years 9 to 13 attainment information is also available.

NB. Please ignore any reference to homework on the screenshots shown below, school has not purchased the homework module. We continue to use Satchel One.

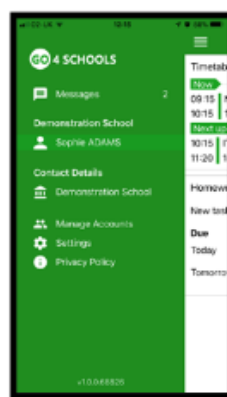

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Messages

Tap on the menu in the top-left corner to access messages and settings.



Messages from your school and your settings can be accessed from this menu.



In the **message inbox** tap on the message for more detail.

Your messages will be organised by date order and titled by areas such as Homework, Behaviour and Detention notifications.

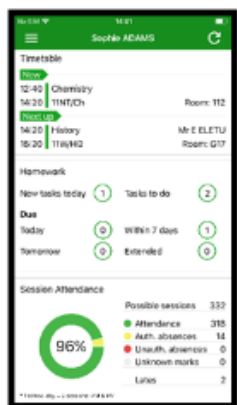
Here is an example of how a message might look.

Timetable detail:

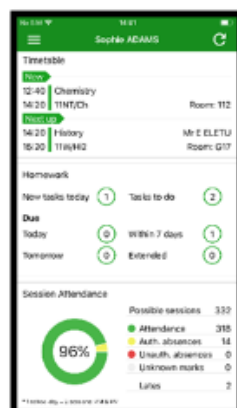
You are then presented with today's timetable. You can tap or swipe to previous and future days at the top.



Attendance:

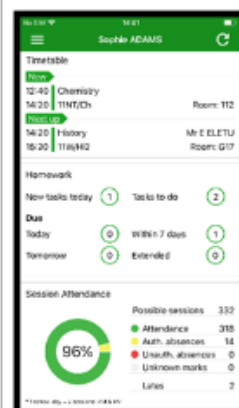
From the main screen scroll down to view attendance information.

A chart displays the overall percentage attendance.



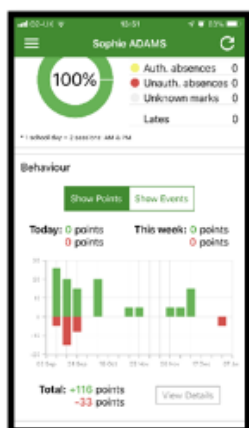
The App will also display detail about specific attendance marks including authorised and unauthorised attendance marks. Late marks are incorporated into the overall attendance marks and unknown marks are waiting for confirmation of the reason for the absence.

NOTE: There are two possible sessions in a school day, AM and PM.

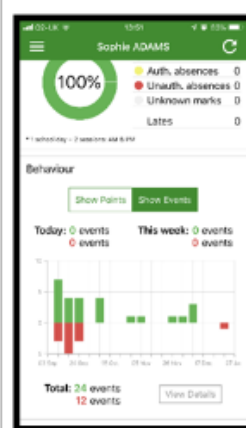


Behaviour:

Continue to scroll down the app to the Behaviour information. This will display a bar chart of both negative and positive behaviour points over time, the chart can be scrolled across throughout the year. Positive points are shown in green and negative points in red with a total points count.



If you prefer you can toggle the graph to show the number of events rather than points. This will allow you to see the number of positive and negative events recorded over time. Again, you can scroll the chart across and positive events are in green and negative events in red.



Behaviour detail:

If you tap the 'details' button or tap in the white space around the behaviour chart you can then view the detailed event record for your child including the date, the subject, the event type and the associated points.

This is useful to see if positive or negative behaviour are occurring in certain lessons.
