A Level Results 2025

- ❑ Average grade C+
 - ❑ Highest performing – A*A*A*A
 - ❑ 15 students achieved top grades of A and A* in 3 or more subjects
 - ❑ 60% of all students achieved at least one A*-B
 - ❑ 46% of all grades were at A*-B
 - ❑ 73% of all grades were at A*-C
 - ❑ 54% of BTEC/OCR National grades at Distinction*/Distinction

- ❑ 72% of students going to university this year
 - ❑ 15% - gap year then university
 - ❑ 13% successfully obtained apprenticeships, accessed further training or are going into employment or the Services
